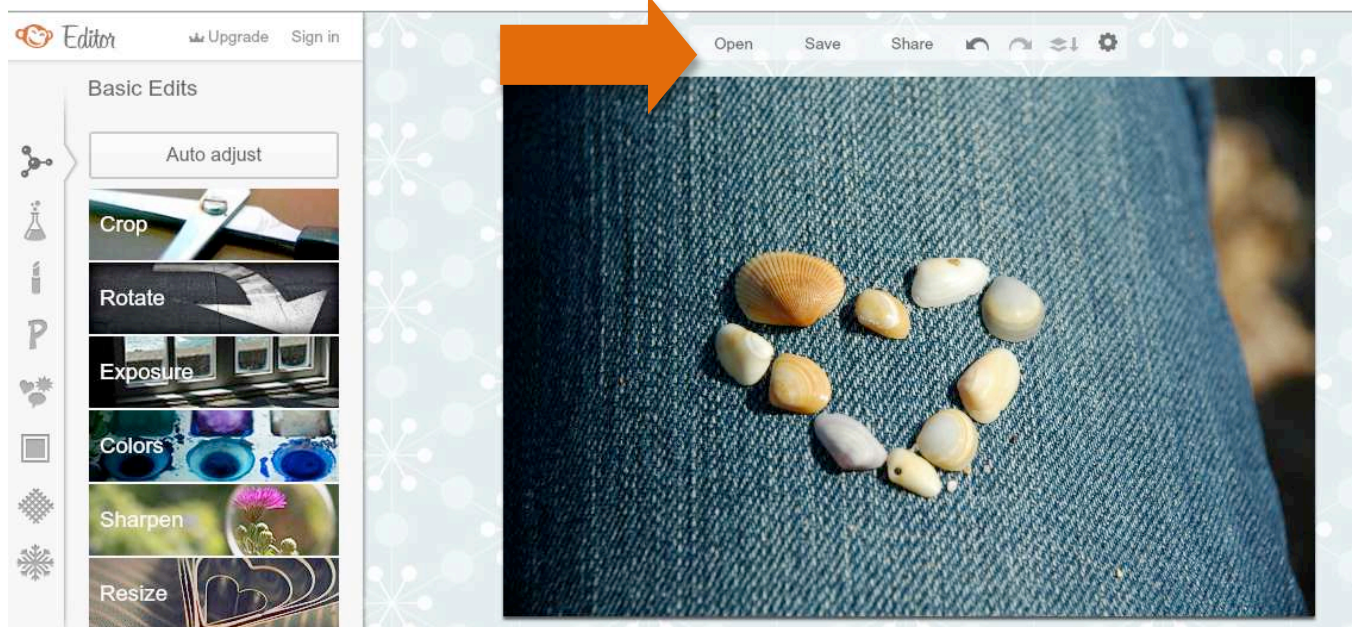
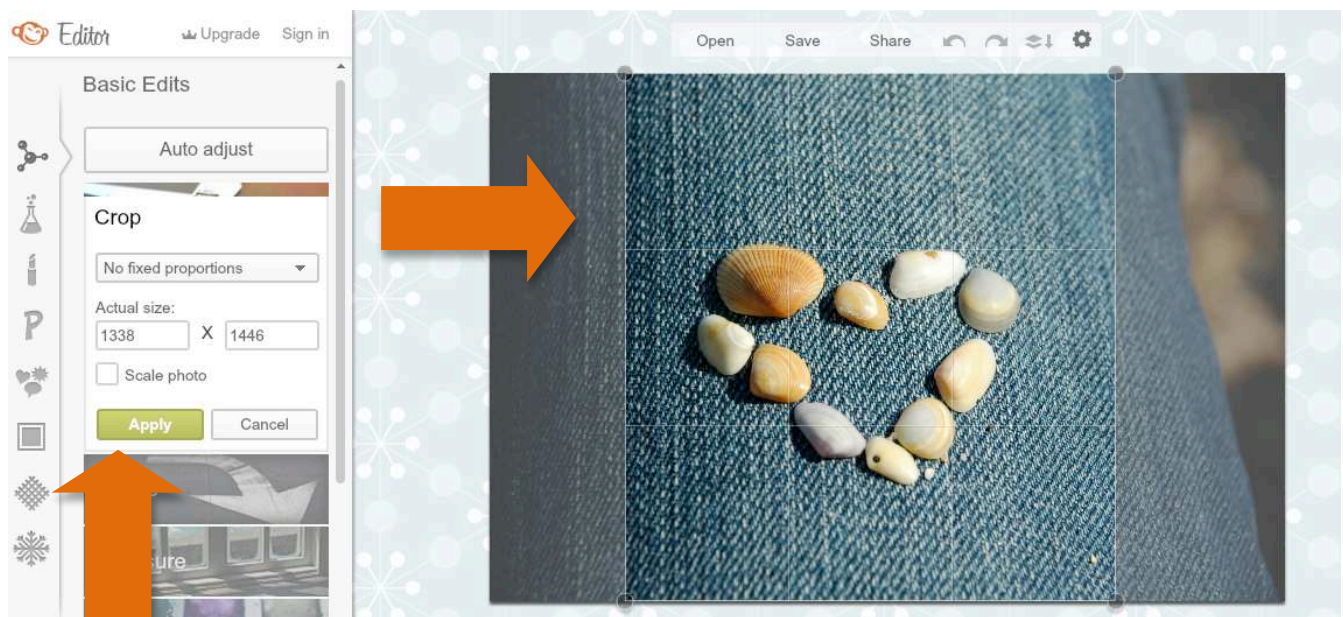


How to make your own Pins using PicMonkey.com

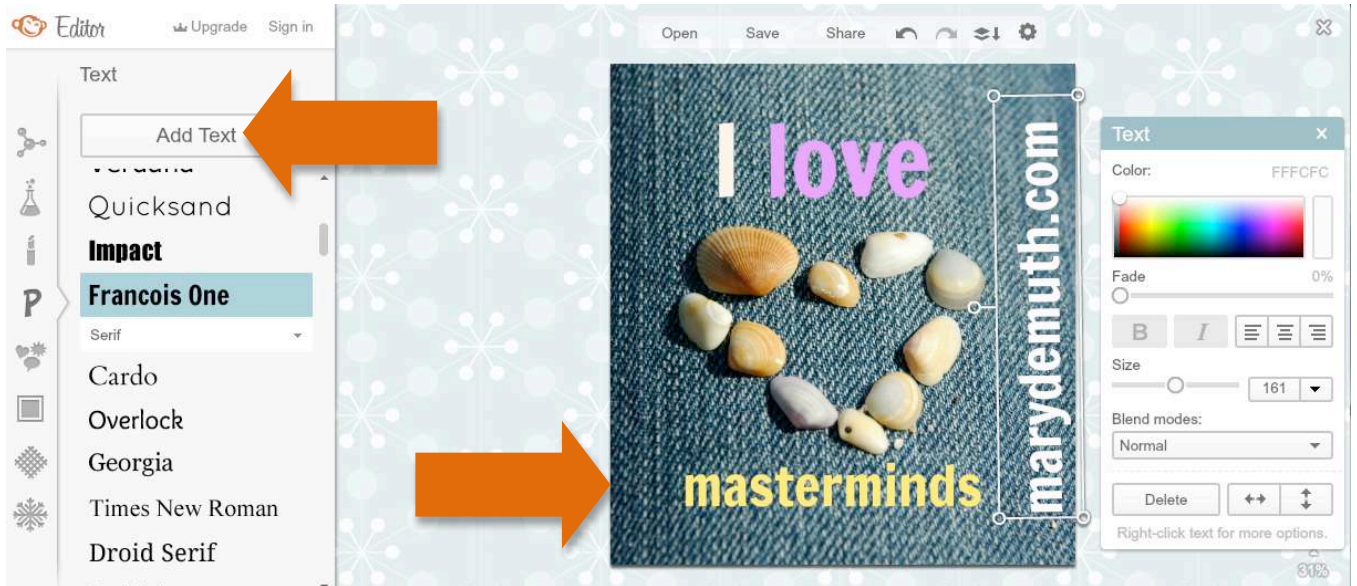
Step one. Open a picture from your hard drive.



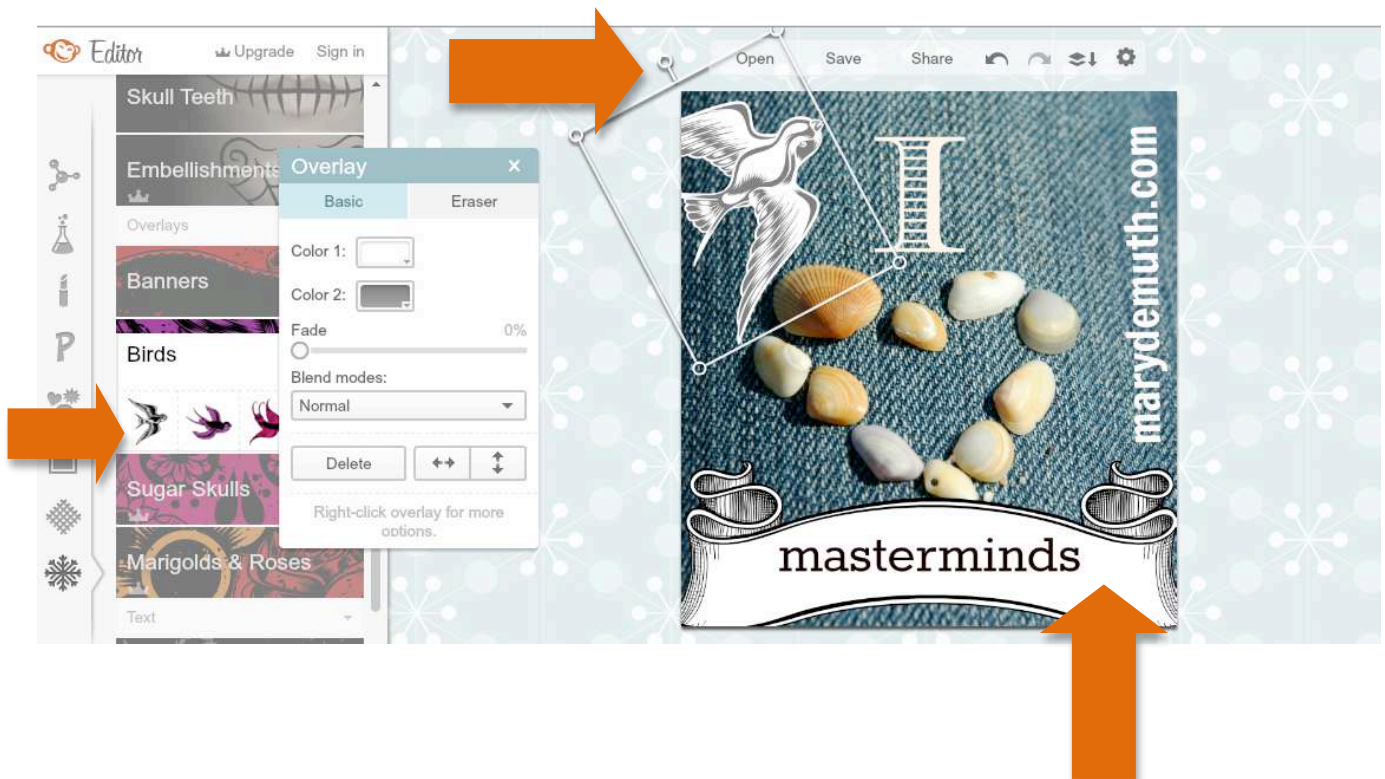
Step two. Crop image into a square.



Step three. Add text.



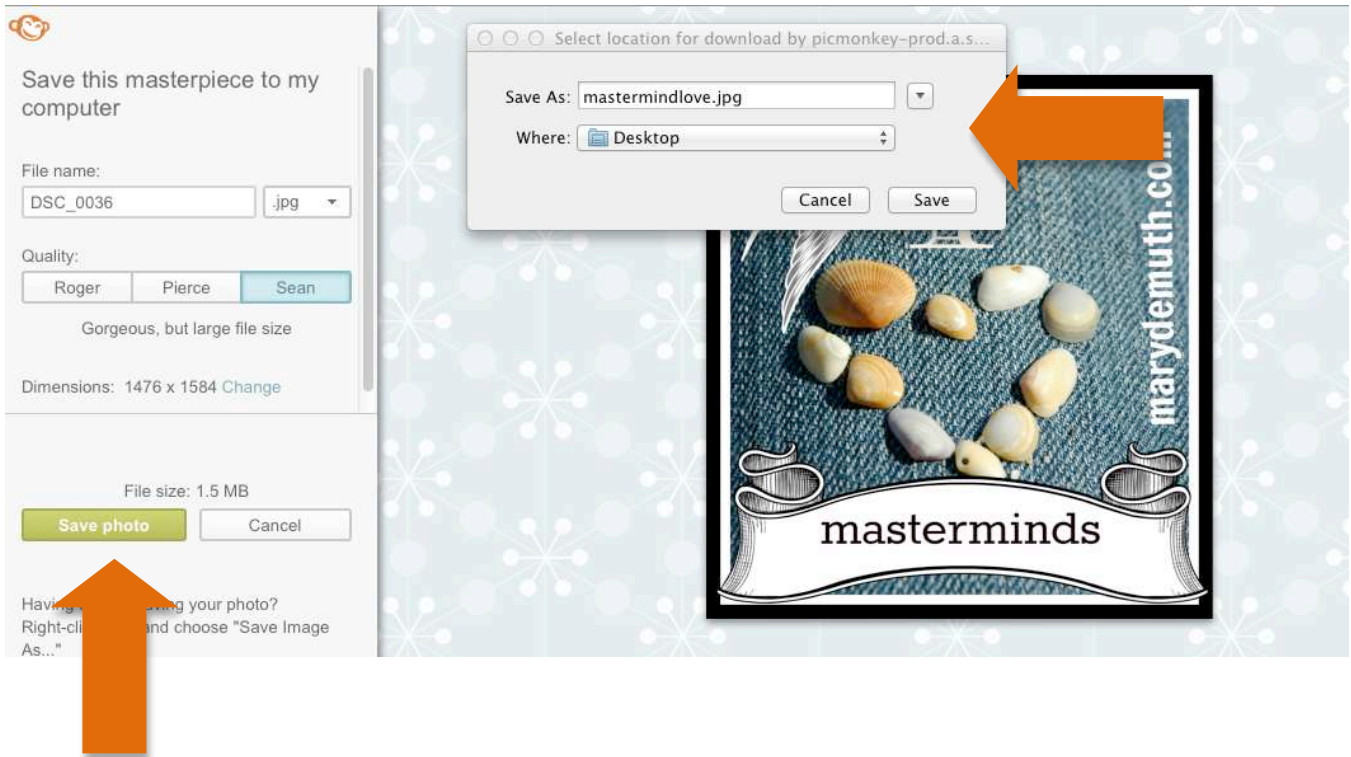
Step four. Add art and embellishments. (I changed my mind on the fonts and color in this step.)

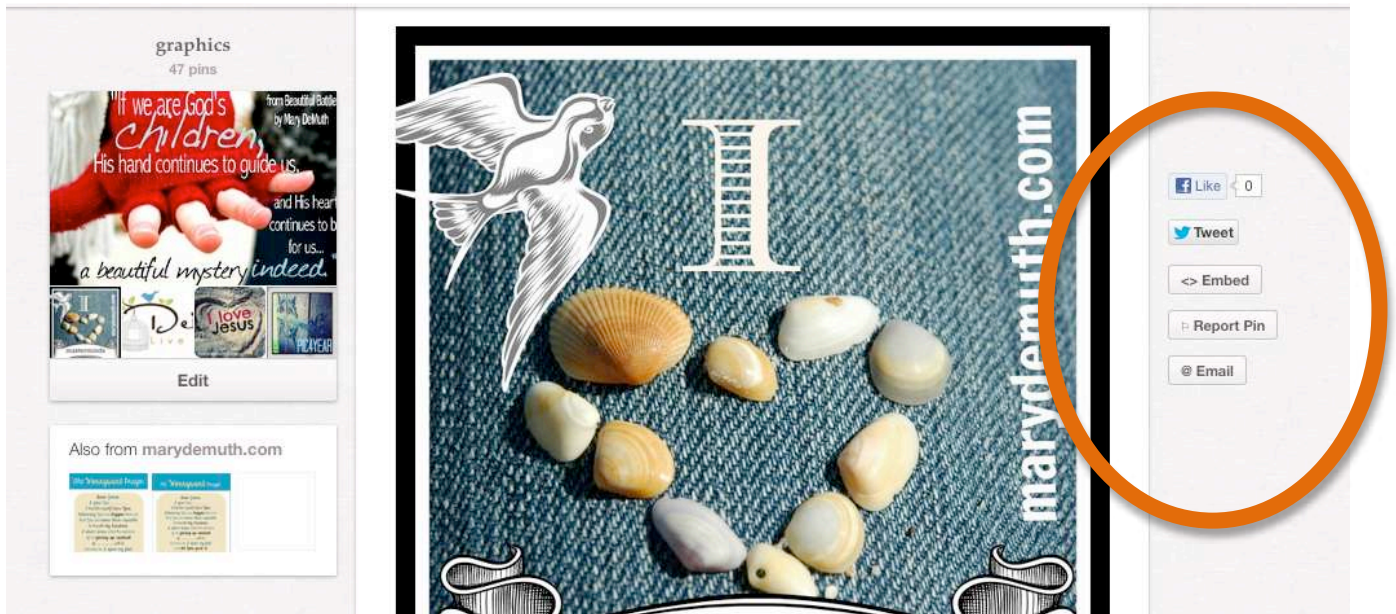
